UDSv4 Update

The National Alzheimer's Coordinating Center (NACC) is excited for the transition from UDSv3 to UDSv4. Here are a few important updates, which were shared at the Fall ADRC Meeting.

UDSv4: The Countdown is On

NACC, the Clinical Task Force, and the Electronic Data Capture Workgroup are working hard to facilitate the transition to UDSv4 in collaboration with the ADRC program! UDSv4 will advance ADRD research and discovery by aligning the UDS with important scientific and clinical advances in the field. Key updates include incorporating 1) social determinants of health, 2) more inclusive demographic questions, 3) new concepts such as subjective cognitive decline, mild behavioral impairment, and a verbal learning test to assess new cognitive domains, and 4) data on use of disease modifying drugs.

The ADRCs will continue to have opportunities to review and provide feedback throughout the UDSv4 roll out.

SCAN Updates

The SCAN Public Dashboard is now available to all on the NACC website! View up-to-date information on how much SCAN-compliant MRI/PET data is available from across the ADRC program. If you are new to the SCAN Dashboards, check out the SCAN Dashboard Quick Guide.

ADRC-Specific SCAN QC Dashboards:

ADRC members with access permissions can now track the QC status of their SCAN submissions. Simply follow the ADRC-specific links in the SCAN Public Dashboard to view your center's data. PLEASE NOTE: To view your center's data, you will need data privilege access, please review the SCAN Dashboard Quick Guide for details.

SCAN summary and analysis data will soon be available to researchers anywhere:

All SCAN variables, including summary, QC, and analysis variables, will be added to the NACC Quick Access File Data Request System this winter. <u>Learn more about NACC's easy to use Data Request Process</u>.

DO NOT SUBMIT YOUR NON-STANDARD DATA TO SCAN:

Please note that the SCAN initiative does not accept non-SCAN compliant MRI and PET images. Existing MRI and PET images collected before January 1, 2021, and prospective images that don't meet SCAN protocol are still accepted by NACC.


ADRC Portals: New Data available online

ADRCs can now access their ADRC-specific SCAN QC dashboards online. This resource enables ADRCs to track in real-time what imaging data they have submitted to SCAN, where it is in the pipeline, and what errors they need to address.

You can also view, audit, and download all your ADRC's SCAN-compliant MRI and PET metadata via the ADRC Portal. Sign in via your <u>site-specific SCAN QC</u>

New NACC ID Assignment Process

To support expanded and more flexible multimodal data collection and integration, NACC is changing the way that NACC IDs are assigned. The biggest changes are that:

- NACC IDs will be assigned at the time the participant is consented and submitted to NACC using a simple form
- NACC ID forms can be entered directly, or uploaded through a CSV or API
- This new system will enable data modalities for participants to be submitted to NACC in any order, integrated, and connected to NACCIDs

Over the coming months NACC will send updates about the development of the new process. We will also open the process for trial and feedback between February and April 2024.

NACC is partnering with Gates Ventures to fund up to three proposals, at \$250k-\$1M (in direct costs) each, focused on advancing Alzheimer's disease and related dementias research and discovery through digital innovation!
