Dear ADRC Program Colleagues,

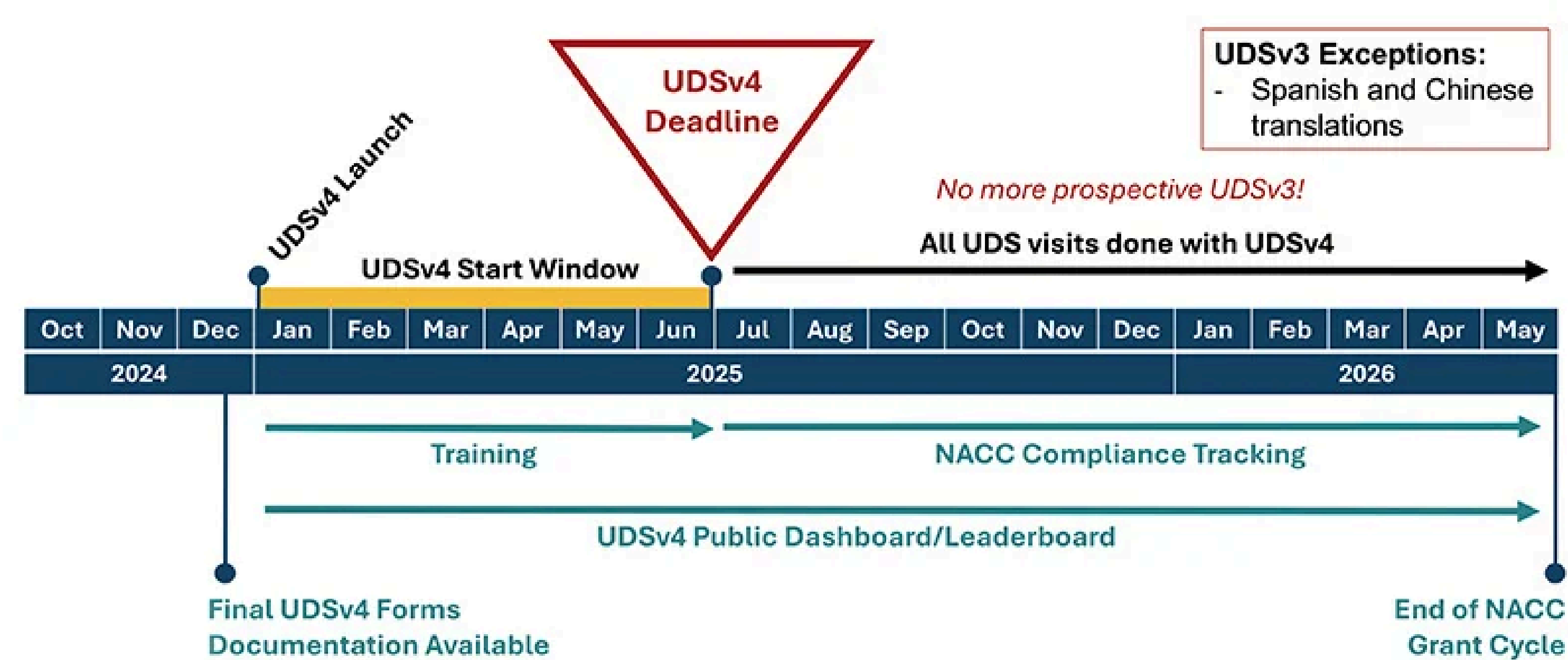
We are excited to officially launch both UDSv4 and the new NACCID process. Starting today, ADRCs can begin collecting and submitting UDSv4 data and will be required to use the new NACCID process. These major updates are designed to enhance data accuracy and standardization across the Alzheimer's Disease Research Centers (ADRC) Program.

## Access the ADRC Portal to Submit, View, and Audit UDSv4 Data

You can now submit, view, and audit UDSv4 data via the [ADRC Portal](#). If you do not have access, your center Administrator must [grant you permission](#) in the [NACC Directory](#).

## UDSv4 Tools and Resources

All ADRCs should start to transition to UDSv4 and centers may complete their transition to UDSv4 for all prospective data collection at any point between now and June 30, 2025, either gradually or on a single date. ## The New NACCID Process

Starting today, ADRCs are required to assign NACCIDs to new participants at the time of consent, prior to any UDSv4 data submission to NACC. To assign a NACCID, ADRCs submit a simple form via the ADRC Portals. NACC then verifies the participant and returns a NACCID to the site within 24 hours. All NACCIDs can be easily retrieved by ADRCs via their ADRC Portals within the NACC Data Platform.
