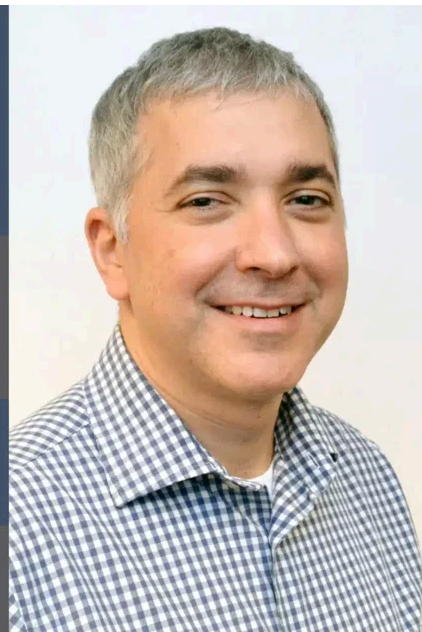
## **Dr. David Wolk, CLARiTI mPI, Sheds Light on LATE**

During his recent presentation at the Wisconsin Alzheimer's Institute (WAI) Annual Update, Dr. Wolk shed light on discoveries around LATE (Limbic-Predominant Age-Related TDP-43 Encephalopathy) and introduced a framework for diagnosing this under-recognized condition. Dr. Wolk and his colleagues have made significant contributions to understanding LATE, a form of dementia characterized by the accumulation of TDP-43 protein in the brain. LATE is both a common mimic of Alzheimer's disease (AD), and also frequently co-occurs with AD, influencing its course and potential response to therapy. These findings emphasize the need for the research that CLARiTI is launching into multi-etiology dementia (MED), which is common but not previously the focus of major cohorts studies and clinical trials, likely slowing the discovery of new treatments. # Study Start Up Updates

## Partial HIPAA Waiver of Authorization

CLARiTI has received approval for a partial waiver of HIPAA Authorization for all participating sites. This waiver covers access to records for subject recruitment and screening participants for enrollment into the study. Please ensure your site has this document listed on a Certificate of Action with WCG. If your site has not yet submitted to WCG, you may reference this already established waiver upon submission. **Please ensure you include this waiver in your regulatory binder.**

## Translation of CLARiTI Study Materials

CLARiTI study materials may be translated into other languages. WCG, our single IRB, contracts with an outside company that provides translation services, paid for by CLARiTI funding. Your site will not receive a bill. You will upload your documents and make the selection to have them translated into the language(s) of your choosing. After documents receive WCG IRB approval and a Certificate of Action is provided to your site, your site will then submit a translation request to WCG. It is best practice to submit all documents that need to be translated in one submission to avoid having multiple submissions. **WCG does not permit use of documents that are translated by outside services.** We will update the CLARiTI Study Handbook with this information in the next version. Please reach out to your project coordinator for assistance.

## CLARiTI Site Initiation Visits (SIV) Updates

Congratulations to the following sites that have completed their SIV with the Central Monitoring Service (CMS): **Wisconsin ADRC, Mayo, Penn ADRC-Memory Center, Boston University ADRC, 1Florida ADRC, University of Kansas ADRC, Stanford ADRC and Johns Hopkins ADRC.** Sites with upcoming SIVs: Wake Forest ADRC and UCSD ADRC. Available upcoming SIV dates: January 31, February 10 & 28 and March 10 & 28, 2025.

- All sites must complete a SIV.
- Sites are eligible for their SIV once they have gained WCG approval and their regulatory documents are completed and filed.

- After you receive approval from Central Monitoring Service (CMS) and a Site Activation letter from CLARiTI, you may begin study activities.
- The expectation is that sites will be ready to begin study activities shortly after the SIV, if site study start-up is delayed, a refresher SIV may be necessary.

### **Plan Ahead!**

It is essential that all regulatory documents are filed in advance of the SIV. SIVs are scheduled for five hours to accommodate time for questions. The site PI is required to be there for the first 2 hours. There is an additional PI debrief (30 min) scheduled after the SIV. Please be in contact with your CLARiTI Administrative Team (CAT) Project Coordinator to make sure your site has been given the greenlight to schedule your SIV. Once your site is approved, you may reach out to the CAT regulatory team to secure a date.

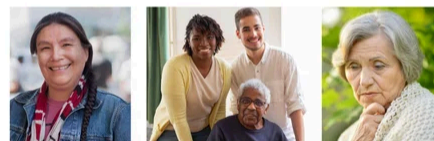
### **Return of Results Brochure Now Available**

The Return of Results (RoR) Core has released the first component of the RoR Toolkit for site implementation: Brain Amyloid Imaging - Learning My Results Brochure. This brochure is designed to provide educational material about amyloid imaging, the meaning of possible amyloid PET results, potential risks and benefits of learning results, and additional considerations. This material has been WCG approved and is available for sites to use as they begin consenting participants to the study.

## **Subaward Progress Update**

We're thrilled to announce that the University of Washington has signed the subaward agreement from the University of Wisconsin.

With this approval, NACC has begun submitting requests to the University of Washington's Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP) to draft and issue subawards for participating sites. Thanks to your collaboration, we've made significant progress - 20 out of 33 sites have been submitted by NACC to University of Washington OSP, marking a key milestone.

The University of Washington OSP will be reaching out to your grants offices with any questions as we move toward issuing the subawards.

### **What You Can Do:**

If your site has not received confirmation from [naccgrants@uw.edu](mailto:naccgrants@uw.edu) that your subaward agreement has been submitted for approval, this indicates that NACC is pending receipt of required documentation from your site. Please ensure your site is ready for submission and respond promptly to any questions from NACC, and/or University of Washington OSP.

### **Timeline:**

The submission and review process will take approximately 6-8 weeks. We anticipate issuing the first subawards in January, with most being processed by Q1 2025.

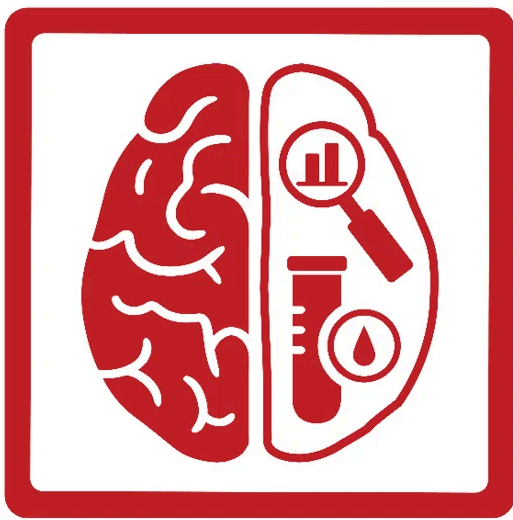
