Study Start Up Updates

Subaward Progress Update

A key milestone has been achieved with the first site completing a fully executed subaward! Additionally, site subawards continue to make progress, with 26 out of 33 sites submitted by NACC to the University of Washington's Office of Sponsored Programs (UWash OSP) to draft and issue subawards for participating sites.

Next Steps:

UWash OSP will be reaching out to your grants offices with any questions as we move forward with the subawards.

We will be reaching out individually to the 7 sites that have pending documentation. Please ensure your site is ready for submission and respond promptly to any questions from NACC and/or UWash OSP.

Timeline:

The submission and review process will take approximately 6-8 weeks. We anticipate issuing the first subawards in January, with most being issued late in Q1 2025.

CLARiTI EDC Launched

We are thrilled to announce that phase 1 of the CLARiTI EDC project on NACC's REDCap AWS instance has launched! This achievement reflects collaboration between the NACC tech team and CLARiTI Administration Team, as well as additional testing support from the Wisconsin ADRC.



The system will roll out to each of the sites as they complete site activation, EDC training, and subaward execution which includes completion of the Data Transfer Use Agreement, paving the way for initial participant enrollments. You will learn more about this system in the February CLARiTI webinar and during your site EDC training once you have completed your SIV.

CLARiTI Site Initiation Visits (SIV) Updates

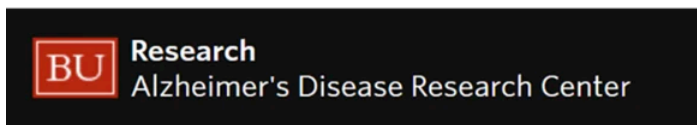

Please note - If your regulatory documents are in order we can take as many as five sites per date.

All sites must complete a SIV. To prepare for the SIV, you will work with the regulatory team and your project coordinator on developing your regulatory binder

for CLARiTI. After you receive approval from Central Monitoring Service (CMS) and a Site Activation letter, you may begin study recruitment activities.

The expectation is that sites will be ready to begin study activation activities shortly after the SIV, if site study start-up is delayed, a refresher SIV may be necessary.

Plan Ahead

It is essential that all regulatory documents are filed in advance of the SIV. SIVs are scheduled for five hours to accommodate time for questions. The site PI is required to be there for the first two hours. There is an additional PI debrief (30 min) scheduled after the SIV. Please be in contact with your CLARiTI Project Coordinator to make sure your site has been given the greenlight to schedule your SIV. Once your site is approved, you may reach out to the CAT regulatory team to secure a date.

Utilizing CLARiTI Protocol for P30 Requirements: On Hold

CLARiTI is revising guidance issued in May 2024 (*CLARiTI and the new P30 imaging requirement*) for sites on utilizing CLARiTI as an umbrella protocol for both P30 imaging requirement and for CLARiTI. We are on hold as our administrative team has run up against barriers with university spending rules and the workflows to support this are still being explored. If your ADRC has questions, please reach out to your CLARiTI project coordinator, Hanzhe Gao or Kelsey Shuda. We will notify all sites when we have more concrete information.

Amyloid Tracer: Flutemetamol

Recently, SCAN has added amyloid tracer Flutemetamol to the list of approved tracers. In the near future, CLARiTI will be adding this change to V4 of the study protocol. A central contract with GE is currently underway. If your site is interested in using Flutemetamol in the future, please contact your CLARiTI project coordinator.

Inclusion Corner

Inclusion Core's Community Research Liaison (CRL) Training Program

As sites complete their onboarding calls with Inclusion Core (IC) and identify their Community Research Liaisons (CRL), the IC will roll out its CRL Training Program. Led by IC's centrally located Community Research Navigators (CRNs), this comprehensive program will orient new CRLs to CLARiTI's mission and protocol with a particular focus on IC's culturally informed, community-engaged research (CI-CER) framework. CRLs will learn why it's important to include underrepresented populations in brain health research. CRL's will tailor their CLARiTI 'elevator pitch' to engage both prospective participants and current ADRC Clinical Core participants. They will also learn how to explain technical neuroimaging concepts to people who are new to research. Site personnel will be invited to an IC onboarding call once the site has completed the Site Initiation Visit.
