## **FY20 Budget Status**

### FY19 enacted level for NIA was \$3.083B

#### Senate committee draft includes:

- An additional \$3B for NIH above FY19 funding levels
- \$3.606B (16.9% increase) for NIA; this figure includes
  \$350M for AD/ADRD research


## House passed bill (HR 2740) includes:

- An additional \$2B for NIH above FY19 funding levels
- \$3.356B (8.8% increase) for NIA
- HR 4378 signed on 9/27/19 funds the Federal government (at FY19 levels) through November 21, 2019



#### **NIA Appropriations**


Fiscal Years 2013-2019



# FY2021 Alzheimer's Disease Bypass Budget






