Emory Roybal Call for Pilots

- \$20,000 to \$100,000 total costs, 1 yr
- LOI due Dec 31, 2019 Notification January 8, 2020
- Full Proposals Due (by invitation only) February 15
- "Caregiving is not one homogenous entity but is *context-specific*. Contexts are framed by various illness conditions, family, cultural, or social caregiving situations, geographical location..."
- 2nd, 3rd marriage, step vs biological children etc



LGBT Caregiver Roybal Project

 2.7 million U.S. older adults (50+) self-identify as LGBT¹ will increase to more than 4 million by 2030.²

- Compared with heterosexual older adults, LGBT older adults experience a higher prevalence of chronic disease and disability, as well as poorer physical and mental health¹
 - Higher rates of smoking, drinking, depression, exposure to violence. More likely to age alone, less likely to marry or have children, families of choice vs blood.



LGBT as a National Health Concern

 Aging disparity related to sexual and gender identity is acknowledged by the NIH,⁴ the National Academy of Medicine ⁵ and the Alz Association.

 Given the national health objectives to reduce health disparities and adverse health outcomes resulting from social, economic, and environmental conditions,⁶ the NIH & NAM has identified LGBT as a key gap in health disparities research.



LGBT Caregivers

- 27% to 45%³ provide care for a loved one with chronic illness.
- Higher rates of physical, emotional, and financial strain, and are more likely to help with medical/nursing tasks ^{7,8}
- Less likely to seek out supportive services ⁹
- Fear of discrimination, denial of services, and receiving poor-quality services may contribute to reluctance to seek assistance ^{7,13}



LGBT caregivers significantly younger (p=0.001) and more frequently reported being single (p<0.001).





LGBT caregivers more racially and ethnically diverse (p=0.001) and more often the adult child, another relative or friend of the older adult care recipient (p=0.001).





Physiological Ramifications of Stress

- •LGBT caregivers who identified as child of care recipient 2.5 times more likely to report high emotional strain (p = 0.008)
- •LGBT adult children more likely to provide care than heterosexual sibling.
- •Depression and stress have been linked to caregiving, and are independent risk factors for dementia 1-3.
- •In addition to subjective indices of stress and depression, stress biomarkers (inflammatory markers, CRP and cortisol) have been shown to be higher in dementia caregivers vs. non-caregivers 14.



Roybal Pilot

• Stage I pilot clinical trial in which we adapt an established, evidence-based caregiver intervention, the Savvy Caregiver Program (SCP), to address the contextspecific challenges faced by LGB informal caregivers of PLWD, and test its acceptability and preliminary efficacy LGB caregivers, and modify the program based on participant and CAB feedback.
