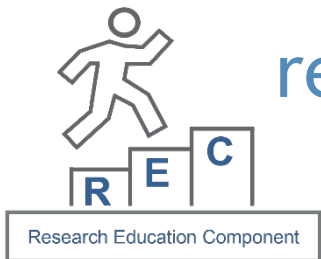


Promoting REC Scholars

- Early career investigators selected by their ADRC
- Participate in specific educational programming and comprehensive ADRC mentorship
- Most sites have ~3-5 Scholars
- In some cases, ADRC RECs may be using alternative terms for these investigators

We want to promote these scholars and give them the resources and support they need to advance their careers

Objective 2

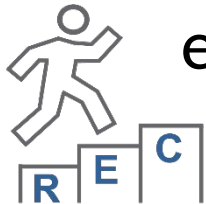
- Create a Core Curriculum

REC Diversity Workgroup

- Recruiting and retaining diverse trainees
- Developing a pipeline for diverse trainees
- Working with current underrepresented trainees to identify what they need for support
- Creating diversity training models for mentors
- Exploring a REC Exchange Program - Connecting diverse trainees with diverse mentors across ADRCs
- Looking at ways to diversify the workforce - Collaborate with ADRCMARs and other organizations
- Spreading the word about diversity related funding opportunities
