


Uploading Data to AD Workbench Workspace


Step 1: Register for AD Workbench

Register at: <https://discover.alzheimersdata.org/>



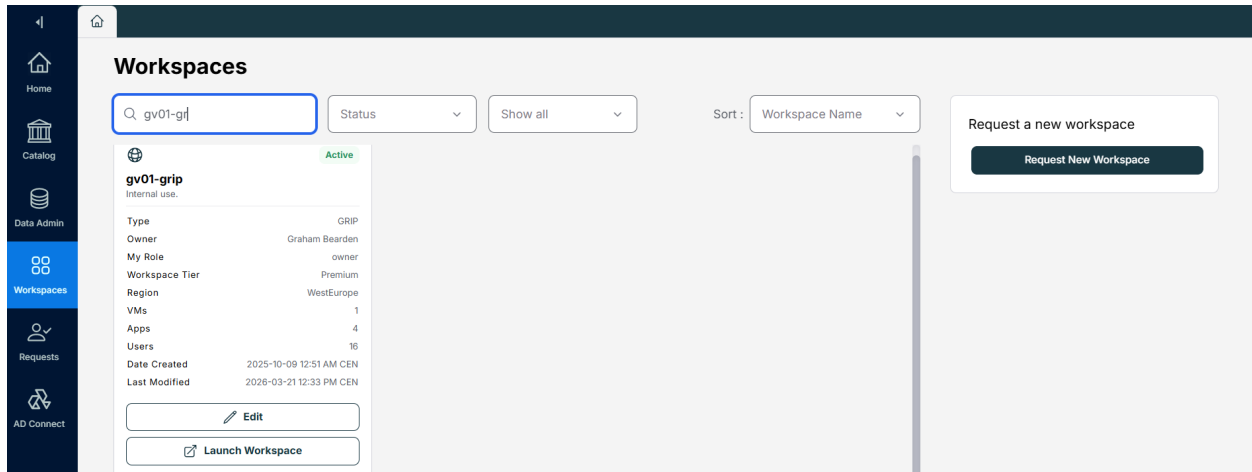
Step 2: Request a Workspace

Login and complete the workspace request form at <https://discover.alzheimersdata.org/workspace>

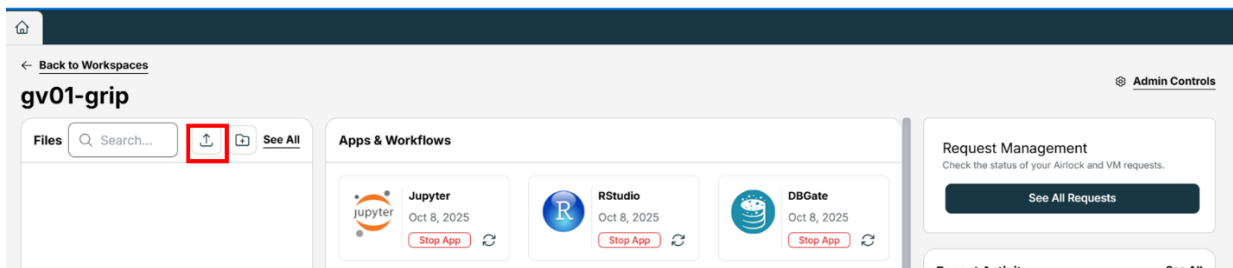


Step 3: Upload Data to Your Workspace

1. Launch your workspace by navigating to “Workspaces” section in the panel on the left.



2. Select the upload icon in the Files section on the left



3. You can click on “Select Files to Upload” section to select and upload files to your workspace from your system using the browser
